SHARPS DISPOSAL AWARENESS

FREE "SHARPS" CONTAINERS - Always Available!

"SHARPS" is the medical term for hypodermic needles, syringes, lancets and anything that is used to cut or penetrate the skin.

Indian River County residents may visit the IRC Health Department, IRC Landfill, or one of the five Customer Convenience Centers during normal operating hours to receive a **FREE** new "SHARPS" container. Properly marked filled containers may also be dropped off at any of these locations.

Appropriate containers include coffee cans and bleach bottles. When the container is $\frac{3}{4}$ full, tape the lid on it with duct tape and clearly mark the container with the word "SHARPS".

And **NEVER, NEVER** put "SHARPS" containers in your recycling bins or trash.
