Services are by appointment only and will be provided by health department clinicians and support staff. Women's wellness services include:

- Women's Wellness Exam (to include Clinical Breast Exam and Pap Smear)
- Blood Pressure Check
- Diabetes and Cholesterol Screenings (Fasting required)
- Eye Screenings
- Testing for STDs
- Update on Immunizations
- Local programs and services for women and much more
